Russell Wray called the meeting to order at 4:00 pm.

Brenda Wright took a roll call of board members.

Russell Wray opened the Public Hearing for Published Budget. No comments were brought forward.

No Oral Communications were presented to the Board.

Russell Wray read the Written Communications.

Russell Wray asked the board for any concerns regarding the Consent Items. No questions were asked. Jeremy Ogle made a motion to approve and it was seconded by Linnea Fletcher. All were in favor. Brad Griffin abstained from the vote.

Erin Volk introduced Sandy Velasquez. Sandy presented the Southern Service Area and Denison Regional Academy Update. Erin introduced Sandy Velasquez as the new Director of Denison Campus and Southern Service Area. Sandy talked about the CNA classes held on the Mapleton campus. She also talked about working on getting an Agriculture pathway with the high school. Sandy then talked about many activities going on at the Denison Campus. They currently have over 300 College Now students attending campus for their classes. They are also working on the Career Academy addition tentatively planned for Fall 25. We are looking to add three classrooms, and Ag lab, and an Auto Body lab. This will draw in a lot more high school students.

Darin Moeller and Carmen Wilson presented the SBDC Subcontract Agreement with Iowa State University of Science and Technology to the Board. This will reflect partial funding. We will see a few more of these throughout the year as they will submit a contract with each partial funding they receive. Linnea Fletcher made a motion to approve and it was seconded by Jeremy Ogle. All were in favor and motion carried.

Darin and Carmen presented the 260E Preliminary Agreement for Seaboard Triumph Foods, LLC. Their plan is to add 150 jobs with this agreement. Tricia Sutherland made a motion to approve and it was seconded by Micah Lang. All were in favor and the motion carried.

Darin and Carmen also presented the Iowa Industrial New Jobs Training Program 260E Seaboard Triumph Foods, LLC Agreement. This program would offer training to new employees. They are planning 120 new positions. Jeremy Ogle made a motion to approve and it was seconded by Blanca Martinez. All were in favor and the motion carried.

Darin and Carmen then presented the Iowa Industrial New Jobs Training Program 260E Knife River Midwest, LLC Agreement. This agreement would fund training for 13 positions. Brad Griffin made a motion to approved and it was seconded by Blanca Martinez. All were in favor and the motion carried.

Darin and Carmen also presented the Iowa Industrial New Jobs Training Program 260E Cold Link Logistics Sioux City, LLC Agreement. This agreement would consist of 44 positions. Linnea Fletcher made a motion to approve and it was seconded by Tricia Sutherland. All were in favor and the motion carried.

Darin and Carmen presented the Iowa Industrial New Jobs Training Program 260E TEC Equipment, Inc. Agreement. This agreement would be for 30 positions. Brad Griffin made a motion to approve and it was seconded by Jeremy. All were in favor and the motion carried.

Darin and Carmen presented the 260E 2024-1 Multiple Project Iowa Industrial New Jobs Training Program. This agenda item directs the publication to go to bond for the electronic bidding. Jeremy Ogle made a motion to approve and it was seconded by Linnea Fletcher. All were in favor and the motion carried.

Troy Jasman presented the Resolution Authorizing Redemption of Outstanding Certificates and Directing Notice be Given – Industrial New Jobs Training Certificates, Series 2016-1. This would close the bond early. Brad Griffin made a motion to approve and it was seconded by Micah Lang. All were in favor and the motion carried.

Troy Jasman also presented the Cherokee Campus Paving Improvements Project Bids. The lowest bid came in under projections. Funding for the project would be covered under a grant received from the State of Iowa. Brad Griffin made a motion to approve and it was seconded by Tricia Sutherland. All were in favor and the motion carried.

Erin Volk presented some Board Policy Changes for a 2nd Reading. Jeremy Ogle made a motion to approve and it was seconded by Blanca Martinez. All were in favor and the motion carried.

Troy Jasman reviewed the Published Budget. A Public Hearing was held last month and now we are ready for approval to publish. We will now present it to the state. Micah Lang made a motion to approve and it was seconded by Erin Muck. All were in favor and the motion carried.

Tricia Sutherland talked about the Community Colleges for Iowa meeting. There is a suggestion to combine the July Trustee conference with the Fall CCFI conference. Tricia is going to have Brenda Wright sent out some talking points when talking to our legislators. They are also looking for different ways to recruit trustees.

Terry Murrell gave a President's Report. He gave a legislative update on some possible changes.

Jeremy Ogle made a motion to go into Executive/Closed Session pursuant to Iowa Code sec.21.5(1)(c) to discuss strategy with legal counsel on a matter presently in litigation, where its disclosure would be likely to prejudice or disadvantage the position of the College in that litigation. Linnea Fletcher seconded. All were in favor and motion carried. Brenda Wright took a roll call. RE: **APRIL 2024 FINANCIAL HIGHLIGHTS**

Executive Summary

General Fund revenues totaled \$2.2 million for the month of April and \$32.1 million year to date. At 84% of annual budget, revenues after ten months are \$814K higher than last year or +2.6%. Year to date revenue, as a percentage of the annual budget, continues to be attributable to the growth in tuition and fee revenue as well as the increase in State General Aid offset by increased scholarships that are netted against tuition and the previous year federal backfill monies due to the pandemic recorded in the Other Income revenue line. General Fund expenditures totaled \$2.7 million for the month and exceeded budget expectations. As a result, the College financial position continues to lag that of the previous year with a decrease in the fund balance change from the prior year of \$2.3 million.

Restricted Fund activity for the month consisted of routine grant transactions as well as \$1.8 million of property tax receipts and \$526K of New Jobs Training Program withholding receipts. Other transactions for the month of April were routine and as expected for the month.

Plant Fund activity for the month included \$688K of property tax payments via the county treasurers. Property tax provides the primary source of Plant Fund revenue. Plant Fund expenditures for the month of April were mainly related to equipment and facility improvement projects.

Auxiliary Enterprise operations for the month of April were routine. Overall, the Auxiliary operations show an increase in the fund balance change from the prior year of \$953K.

The College's cash flow remained strong in April, reflecting property tax collections which support the General Fund, selected Restricted Funds and the Plant Fund. Cash and investments on a consolidated basis totaled \$50.2 million at April 30th, an increase of \$3.2 million from March. The College's investment portfolio's overall yield at 4.29% was slightly lower from the 4.31% of the previous month.

Included with May's request for Board consent for payment are the debt service payments due June 1, 2024 on previously issued NJTP certificates and dormitory revenue bonds. These payments total some \$3.4 million.

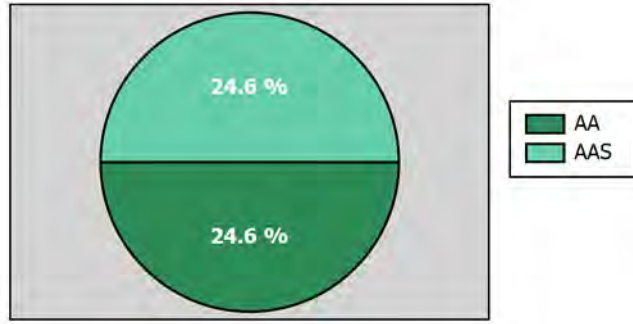

By offering Project SUCCESS, WITCC is fulfilling our mission to economically enhance our community and specifically, address the needs of learners whose challenges often preclude their successful participation and integration into post-secondary education and/or satisfying employment.

Project SUCCESS will begin its 10th year in the fall and has grown from serving only the Sioux City Community Schools and eight students, to its current roster of 8 school districts and 15 students. School districts that plan to be served by the program in the 2024-2025 academic year include:

Cherokee, MOC-Floyd Valley, MVAOCO, Sergeant Bluff-Luton, Sibley-Ocheyedan, Sioux Center, Sioux City, and South O'Brien

**CONTRACT FOR PROJECT SUCCESS TRANSITIONAL SERVICES 2024-2025
at the Western Iowa Tech Community College site in Sioux City, Iowa**

This contract between Sioux City Community School District (East High) and Western Iowa Tech Community College, is to contract for the provision of secondary special education Project SUCCESS transition services for Pehdyn Lawrey, and Jonthon Lipscomb pursuant to his/her Individualized Education Program (IEP) developed by the IEP team of the Sioux City Community School District (East High).

Sioux City Community School District (East High) is required by Iowa Code to provide special education support services, media and instructional services to enrolled students within its boundaries without charge.

Sioux City Community School District (East High) and Western Iowa Tech Community College agree to the following terms and conditions:

PARTIES

The Participating Parties to this contract are as follows:

A. The Sioux City Community School District (East High) is located in the County of Woodbury, State of Iowa, with its principal office at 627 4th Street, Sioux City, IA 51101.

B. Western Iowa Tech Community College is located in the County of Woodbury, State of Iowa, with its principal office at 4647 Stone Avenue, Sioux City, IA 51106.

PURPOSE

This document describes the contractual arrangement between the Sioux City Community School District (East High) and Western Iowa Tech Community College for the provision of secondary level special education Project SUCCESS transition services for a resident student who needs services beyond what can be offered at the local district level for the student to receive a Free Appropriate Public Education (FAPE).

The intent of Project SUCCESS transition services is to provide secondary IEP services on an individualized basis, as needed, for as long as the services are needed, as long as the student remains eligible for services and if such a placement is appropriate according to a student's IEP team. The Individuals with Disabilities Education Act (IDEA) mandates that the resident district still holds responsibility and accountability for appropriateness of services and educational progress for each student. IDEA also mandates that IEPs must remain individualized. All weighting decisions will be made based on the student's needs as listed in the IEP and will be made by the Area Education Agency (AEA). Sioux City Community School District (East High) remains accountable and responsible for appropriateness of services for, and educational progress of, the student. It is not appropriate to change a student's weighting based on

anticipated costs. Weighting shall only change based on student needs related to the student's disability as listed on the IEP.

JURISDICTION

The Sioux City Community School District (East High) student placed in the Western Iowa Tech Community College Project SUCCESS services shall be allowed to participate in the student activities in and will be subject to the eligibility rules of Sioux City Community School District (East High). Sioux City Community School District (East High) students placed in the Western Iowa Tech Community College Project SUCCESS services continue to be enrolled in Sioux City Community School District (East High) and are subject to the testing requirements, graduation requirements, and disciplinary procedures of the district, as appropriate or determined necessary. Appropriately licensed teachers employed by Western Iowa Tech Community College will administer required assessments and will forward the results of the individual assessments to Sioux City Community School District (East High). Sioux City Community School District (East High) remains responsible for the achievement of its resident students. Permanent school records shall be maintained at the Sioux City Community School District (East High).

Sioux City Community School District (East High) shall be actively involved in evaluation of its students and monitoring adherence to all pertinent state and federal laws, including, but not limited to: testing requirements, IDEA provisions, FERPA provisions, teacher licensure, curriculum development, and core curriculum implementation.

Students shall be under the jurisdiction and general supervision of, and be the responsibility of, Sioux City Community School District (East High) while placed in the Western Iowa Tech Community College Project SUCCESS services, except as set out in this contract, and shall be subject to the same academic, disciplinary, and other additional requirements that apply to Sioux City Community School District (East High) resident students with IEPs. All disciplinary or other hearings, if any, will be conducted by the Sioux City Community School District (East High) administration or board of education, or the Western Iowa Tech Community College administration or board, as appropriate.

GENERAL PROVISIONS

Western Iowa Tech Community College is contracted to provide transition services and other related services for individual eligible students as listed on the student's IEP and necessary to provide FAPE. All instruction and services are secondary education and services rather than postsecondary. A separate contract for each student will be prepared for this purpose. A course, if any, must be incidental to the transition services being provided—not the service itself. Any course required for a special education service to be funded with special education funding must be specially designed instruction or a transition service as described in the student's IEP. Transition may be achieved/completed without regard to any postsecondary education or Project SUCCESS services schedule.

Secondary students with IEPs may participate in classes provided by postsecondary institutions that are not required under their IEPs under the same provisions in Iowa Code as secondary students without IEPs. These would be Postsecondary Enrollment Options (PSEO), concurrent enrollment, Project Lead the Way (PLTW), and secondary education courses provided under contract with the local school district. Whether or not the community college will grant postsecondary credit for secondary education courses will be determined by board policy at the community college.

Project SUCCESS services shall not be a scholarship. Students with IEPs are first general education students and might not need special education services for the entire day. Students with IEPs are entitled to services in the least restrictive environment.

If community college policy allows, and it does not interfere with FAPE special education Project SUCCESS transition services, the student is not prevented by this contract from privately enrolling in postsecondary courses. Any modifications or accommodations during those courses would be under the Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA) and section 504 rather than IDEA. From the Dear Parent Letter 2007 issued by the Office for Civil Rights (OCR), "Institutions of postsecondary education must provide appropriate academic adjustments based on students' disabilities and individual needs when necessary to avoid discrimination. In providing an academic adjustment, the postsecondary institution does not have to eliminate or lower essential requirements or make modifications that would result in a fundamental alternation of the program or activities being offered or impose an undue burden on the institution... Institutions of postsecondary education may not require students with disabilities to pay part or all of the costs of academic adjustments. Postsecondary institutions may not condition their provision of academic adjustments on the availability of funds, refuse to spend more than a certain amount to provide academic adjustments, or refuse to provide academic adjustments because they believe other providers of such services exist."

Residential living costs on campus are a student choice at parental cost except under two situations: 1) living skills are necessary according to the IEP and residential costs are necessary to provide FAPE or 2) if the resident district placed the student too far away from home, as determined by the school district, for special education services to return home daily. If the Sioux City Community School District (East High) is requiring the student to live on campus, the costs covered will be the dorm housing and the dorm food plan. Personal living items (toilet paper, soap, toothbrush, etc.) are personal costs to the student/parents. These items are provided by, consumed by, and retained by the student or parents.

Should a Project SUCCESS student living in the dorms withdraw prior to the dates below, the school will be refunded a percentage of the room and board costs.

Fall term:

Prior to October 1	70% refund
Prior to November 1	50% refund

Spring term:

Prior to February 15	70% refund
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Prior to March 15 50% refund

Project SUCCESS services for this student will be provided by Western Iowa Tech Community College in accordance with this contract. Western Iowa Tech Community College shall directly provide the special education services and shall not subcontract with another entity (wrap around contracts).

The Western Iowa Tech Community College Project SUCCESS services are purchased services and not a program of Sioux City Community School District (East High). As a purchased service provider, Western Iowa Tech Community College shall not be paid prior to services being rendered or materials received. Reimbursement for Project SUCCESS services expenses will be made on a cost basis upon request for payment after services are delivered.

Communication Processes and Procedures

Ongoing communication between the Western Iowa Tech Community College Project SUCCESS services director and the Sioux City Community School District (East High) designee is necessary. Procedures for serving students with the Western Iowa Tech Community College Project SUCCESS services are described and agreed upon in this contract. Changes to these procedures by either party must be approved in writing by Sioux City Community School District (East High) prior to implementation.

Sioux City Community School District (East High) is responsible for the content of the IEP, monitoring the student's goal progress, and ensuring appropriate implementation of specially designed instruction (SDI), supports and services.

Western Iowa Tech Community College Project SUCCESS services will be responsible for providing transition services instruction, including specially designed instruction according to the student's IEP. Any special designed secondary instruction must also be according to the student's IEP and with a focus on achieving Iowa Core Standards.

Western Iowa Tech Community College Project SUCCESS services will be responsible for collecting and recording progress monitoring data as described in the student's IEP. Regular communication regarding student goal(s) and general academic progress will take place between Western Iowa Tech Community College Project SUCCESS services and Sioux City Community School District (East High) quarterly, at a minimum; more often, if necessary.

Determining Appropriateness of Placement for Western Iowa Tech Community College Project SUCCESS services

- The Sioux City Community School District (East High) IEP team will use the knowledge of the student's present levels of academic achievement, current level of performance and intake criteria for the Western Iowa Tech Community College Project SUCCESS services to determine the appropriateness of placement into the Project SUCCESS services, based upon whether participation in these services, or parts of these services, are necessary for the student to receive FAPE.

- Membership of the IEP team will include the Western Iowa Tech Community College Project SUCCESS services teacher or representative.

Procedures for Review of Progress and Continuing Services

- The Western Iowa Tech Community College Project SUCCESS services teacher will be responsible for collecting and recording progress monitoring data into the Web IEP system as required by IDEA (minimum of every other week progress monitoring or more frequently as specified in the IEP) and other relevant information and providing regular (at least quarterly) reports to Sioux City Community School District (East High).
- Progress monitoring and decision-making is carried out on an ongoing basis. At the end of each progress reporting period, the student's progress on the IEP goals and the status of special education services, activities, and supports should be reviewed and reported to parents and students who have reached the age of majority.
- The student will continue to work on unmet goals remaining on his/her IEP.
- The student will be considered as "finished" with the Western Iowa Tech Community College Project SUCCESS services when District IEP criteria for Pehdyn Lawrey, and Jonthon Lipscomb is completed (SPECIFIC IEP RELATED CRITERIA LISTED IN ATTACHMENT/EXHIBIT A) and the student would then be eligible to receive his/her diploma. This may occur at any point in time and would not necessarily coincide with the end of the Project SUCCESS services, semester, or academic year. The IEP should not say, and the transition plan should not be, to assist the student to obtain a postsecondary degree or certificate.

INSTRUCTIONAL SERVICES

SPECIFIC SPECIAL EDUCATION SERVICES TO BE PROVIDED BY Western Iowa Tech Community College TO Pehdyn Lawrey and Jonthon Lipscomb.

(SPECIFIC IEP RELATED SERVICES LISTED IN ATTACHMENT/EXHIBIT A)

PURCHASED SERVICES

Within fifteen (15) days after the end of each semester, Western Iowa Tech Community College will provide to Sioux City Community School District (East High) appropriate special education transition services costs associated with placement of the student in the Western Iowa Tech Community College Project SUCCESS services. There shall be no per pupil or per diem billing amounts.

Billings from Western Iowa Tech Community College, as a purchased service, must be "itemized" in sufficient detail so that Sioux City Community School District (East High) can meet its legally-required fiscal responsibilities, including but not limited to, the ability to:

- Determine performance of the IEP requirements for each of its students.
- Report expenditures from the correct funding source in accordance with the permissive uses of public education funds.

- Ensure costs are itemized for the purpose of submitting Medicaid claims or special education claims or determining that such claims have been filed and billed costs reduced by that amount.
- Ensure the costs are limited to actual costs of special education as defined by Iowa Code.
- Ensure each item is an item on the student's IEP.
- Ensure items such as services of a nurse are identified and are linked only to students with services of a nurse included on the individual student's IEP.
- Ensure each item is paid from the correct fund.
- Ensure each item is paid from the correct funding stream (special education weighted funding, IDEA Part B, LEP, Title 1, general purpose funding).
- Ensure any administrative costs are allowable and itemized for the purpose of requesting permission from the School Budget Review Committee (SBRC) to pay those costs from special education weighted funding rather than general purpose funding.
- Ensure no costs were paid from grants or other funding resources Western Iowa Tech Community College received or was entitled to receive to address the potential for any cost to be paid by Sioux City Community School District (East High) which was properly paid from a different source. The IDEA provides that education agencies are payors of last resort.
- Ensure costs are reasonable. The district has a stewardship responsibility to evaluate the cost effectiveness of purchasing services versus providing the services directly, as well as to have procedures in place to meet the requirements of the Office of Management and Budget (OMB) Omni-Circular related to procurement.
- Ensure no costs are "per pupil or per diem rates."
- Ensure no costs are related to purchasing spaces or other phantom student models.

In addition to the actual costs of special education as defined in this contract, the following costs, where appropriate, may be billed and paid from the appropriate funding source if itemized and clearly identified:

- Professional development and teacher travel that is specific and unique to the Sioux City Community School District (East High) students placed for the Western Iowa Tech Community College Project SUCCESS services.
- The cost of supplies and equipment that are not included in actual costs of special education but are directly utilized by the Sioux City Community School District (East High) students placed for the Western Iowa Tech Community College Project SUCCESS services and are exclusively used for the Western Iowa Tech Community College Project SUCCESS services.
- The cost of supervision of teachers by an appropriately licensed special education administrator, if time records are maintained and the time records support a specific portion of the time of the special education director was exclusively devoted to special education, and the portion which was not, and exclusively devoted to the Western Iowa Tech Community College Project SUCCESS services. These costs are paid from the appropriate sources when administrative costs are not approved by the School Budget Review Committee (SBRC) to be paid from special education funding.
- The cost of purchased treatment services (whether from the AEA or from a private provider licensed to provide that treatment) where that treatment is incidental to the

Project SUCCESS transition services and will enhance the special education student's ability to benefit from the Project SUCCESS transition services.

- The costs of services or staff available to all Western Iowa Tech Community College students, such as registrar, counselor, administration, clerical, and similar general staff, cannot be billed to Woodbury nor to the students.

Support services for special education, media, and instructional services are responsibilities of the AEA, and shall be provided at no cost to the districts.

Project SUCCESS TRANSITION SERVICES OPERATION

Western Iowa Tech Community College agrees as follows:

- A. Western Iowa Tech Community College will provide a facility for the Project SUCCESS services that meets the state and federal requirements for a school site.
- B. Western Iowa Tech Community College will provide appropriate instructional textbooks, materials, supplies, and equipment for student instruction. Costs to provide FAPE will be paid by Sioux City Community School District (East High). There must, however, be a direct connection between the IEP and the costs. Supplies paid for by are the property of Sioux City Community School District (East High). Sioux City Community School District (East High) may sell them at cost to the student if the student wants to purchase them or if the district policy is to sell such items to all students. If general supplies are the responsibility of every student, they remain the general responsibility for these students the same as non-disabled students. Education Department General Administrative Regulations (EDGAR) and Iowa Code section 297.22 must be followed on disposition of equipment. If the student/parents decide to purchase the items instead of the district to that they can retain ownership of the items; it should be documented in the IEP that the district offered to pay, and the parents made the choice to privately purchase instead.
- C. Western Iowa Tech Community College will provide qualified staff, including teachers licensed by the Iowa Board of Educational Examiners (BOEE), to provide secondary student instruction and related services. Western Iowa Tech Community College will provide documentation to Sioux City Community School District (East High), no later than the first day of the school year, or for newly hired staff within five (5) days of the beginning of employment, copies of all licensure and endorsement of each instructor (regular and substitute) employed by Western Iowa Tech Community College for the Project SUCCESS services. Only Western Iowa Tech Community College shall be the employing party for purpose of Chapter 279, collective bargaining, individual contracts and assignments, and shall be responsible for the payment of salary and benefits.
- D. Western Iowa Tech Community College shall provide special education and related services to students placed for Project SUCCESS services, pursuant to the terms of the students' IEPs.
- E. Western Iowa Tech Community College shall submit all requested reports to Sioux City Community School District (East High) to utilize or to submit to the Iowa Department of Education (Department) or SBRC for services, costs, or other data associated placement of a Sioux City Community School District (East High) student for Project SUCCESS services.

- F. Western Iowa Tech Community College will not place on a waiting list the student for whom this contract is written.
- G. If Western Iowa Tech Community College is unable to provide or continue to provide a service listed on the IEP of the student, Western Iowa Tech Community College shall notify Sioux City Community School District (East High) at least one month prior to discontinuing that service. It shall be the responsibility of Sioux City Community School District (East High) to determine through its IEP team if the service is still necessary, and if so, to obtain an alternative provider for that service.
- H. The school calendar shall be that of Western Iowa Tech Community College.
- I. Western Iowa Tech Community College shall maintain daily attendance records on students placed for Project SUCCESS services and submit those records to Sioux City Community School District (East High) within 15 days of the end of each semester (and summer session if extended school year (ESY) services are listed on the IEP).
- J. Sioux City Community School District (East High) is responsible for transporting the student to the Western Iowa Tech Community College Project SUCCESS services where the Sioux City Community School District (East High) placed the student if the student qualifies for transportation (either based on distance or special transportation on an IEP). The method of transportation shall be determined by Sioux City Community School District (East High).

PROPERTY

Existing equipment or assistive technology of Sioux City Community School District (East High) for this student may be used in the Western Iowa Tech Community College Project SUCCESS services. Such use will be determined by the district in consultation with Western Iowa Tech Community College based upon the appropriate need for the item. An inventory of exchanged items will be maintained.

Upon termination of this contract, identifiable exchanged items shall be returned to Sioux City Community School District (East High). All items purchased by Western Iowa Tech Community College for the Project SUCCESS services billed to Sioux City Community School District (East High) during the term of this contract shall be the property of Sioux City Community School District (East High). However, items purchased by Western Iowa Tech Community College for the Project SUCCESS services not billed to Sioux City Community School District (East High) during the term of this contract shall remain property of Western Iowa Tech Community College.

AMENDMENTS

The provisions of this Contract may be added to, amended or modified by Sioux City Community School District (East High) and Western Iowa Tech Community College as approved by their respective boards. Votes must be cast at a duly called meeting by all board members physically present.

DISPUTE RESOLUTION AND ARBITRATION

In the event that Sioux City Community School District (East High) and Western Iowa Tech Community College are unable to agree to the interpretation or operation of this Agreement, the dispute shall be referred to a "Conflict Resolution Committee" made up of the president and vice-president of the board of directors of the Sioux City Community School District (East High) and of Western Iowa Tech Community College. The Committee shall meet to discuss the dispute and make recommendations to the administrators as to resolution of the dispute.

In the event that the dispute remains unresolved, the Sioux City Community School District (East High) and Western Iowa Tech Community College shall request that a mediator knowledgeable in Iowa school district matters be appointed by the chief administrator of Pehdyn Lawrey, and Jonthon Lipscomb assist in a negotiated resolution to the dispute.

In the event that mediation does not resolve the dispute, it will be submitted to arbitration by a single neutral arbitrator who is knowledgeable in Iowa school district matters appointed by the chief administrator of Pehdyn Lawrey, and Jonthon Lipscomb.

DURATION AND TERMINATION

Subject to the rights of amendment, modification or termination, this contract shall be in full force and in effect from the date of execution until transitional services have been completed for this student unless participation is terminated by Western Iowa Tech Community College or Sioux City Community School District (East High) by providing written notice to the other at least one month prior to termination or terminated by mutual agreement.

CROSS INDEMNIFICATION

If any claim for damage, injury or other loss (hereinafter "loss") is made by or on behalf of a student, the party transporting or supervising the student at the time of the loss (Sioux City Community School District (East High) or Western Iowa Tech Community College) shall be responsible for any payment of claims, damages, or judgments arising out of the loss, and that transporting entity shall indemnify, defend and hold harmless the non-transporting or non-supervising party. Sioux City Community School District (East High) and Western Iowa Tech Community College agree to carry liability insurance or otherwise contract for coverage of claims consistent with this Contract.

Otherwise, to the extent permitted by law, Sioux City Community School District (East High) and Western Iowa Tech Community College shall protect, defend, hold harmless, and indemnify the other party from and against any and all claims, losses, costs, damages, and expenses including attorneys' fees and expenses, which may incur by reason of the indemnifying party's negligence, breach of this Agreement, or violation of law or right of a third party, or that of the indemnifying party's officers, employees, or agents.

APPLICATION OF LAWS, RULES AND REGULATIONS

This contract and all policies, rules, and regulations adopted by the parties to govern the operation of the Project SUCCESS services shall comply with the laws of the state of Iowa, with rules and regulations of the Department, and with federal laws and regulations. Any provisions of this Agreement in conflict therewith shall be null and void; however, the remainder of the Agreement shall be binding.

Sioux City Community School District (East High) and Western Iowa Tech Community College shall refrain from any action which would violate any law, rule, policy, or regulation of any governmental body or agency having jurisdiction over this contract.

Sioux City Community School District (East High) and Western Iowa Tech Community College agree to cooperate as needed to assure that all required services and responsibilities are provided by Sioux City Community School District (East High) and Western Iowa Tech Community College and that the Project SUCCESS services, including any educational components and activities, are operated in compliance with all applicable laws.

BINDING EFFECT

This contract shall be binding upon and inure to the benefit of Sioux City Community School District (East High) and Western Iowa Tech Community College hereto and their successors and assignees.

SEVERABILITY

If any clause, provision or section of this Agreement shall, for any reason, be held illegal or invalid by a court or state or federal agency, the illegality or invalidity of such clause, provision or section shall not affect any of the remaining clauses, provisions or sections hereof, and this Agreement shall be construed and enforced as if such illegal or invalid clause, provision or section had not been contained herein. In case any agreement or obligation contained in this Agreement is held to be in violation of law, then such agreement or obligation shall be deemed to be the agreement or obligation of the members, to the full extent permitted by law.

In commemoration of this Contract, the presidents of Sioux City Community School District (East High) and Western Iowa Tech Community College sign this contract on the dates set below, the contract having been passed by a majority roll call vote of each governing board. This contract shall become effective upon approval and execution by Sioux City Community School District (East High) and Western Iowa Tech Community College.

RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE ISSUANCE OF \$2,095,000 INDUSTRIAL NEW JOBS TRAINING CERTIFICATES, SERIES 2024-1, AND PROVIDING FOR THE SECURING OF SUCH CERTIFICATES FOR THE PURPOSE OF CARRYING OUT AN INDUSTRIAL NEW JOBS TRAINING PROGRAM PROJECT DESIGNATED AS THE 2024-1 MULTIPLE PROJECT; APPROVAL OF CONTINUING DISCLOSURE CERTIFICATE

WHEREAS, the College has entered into one or more Industrial New Jobs Training Agreements by resolution of this Board, as authorized by the Iowa Industrial New Jobs Training Act, Chapter 260E of the Code; and

WHEREAS, the Agreement(s) provides for new jobs training by providing education and training of workers for new jobs comprising the Project; and

WHEREAS, it is presently estimated that the costs of carrying out the purposes and provisions of the Project, including the purpose set forth in Section 3 hereof, exceed \$2,095,000, and provisions must now be made by the College to provide for the payment of such costs by issuing Industrial New Jobs Training Certificates pursuant to the Act; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to the provisions of Chapter 260E, Code of Iowa, as amended, the Certificates have been sold and action should be taken to issue the Certificates conforming to the terms and conditions of the best bid received; and

WHEREAS, it is now necessary and advisable that provisions be made for the issuance of Certificates to the amount of \$2,095,000 payable solely from the income and proceeds of the Revenue Fund as hereafter defined; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to notice published as required by Chapter 260E of the Code of Iowa, as amended, this Board has stated its intent to institute proceedings for the issuance of not to exceed \$2,200,000 Industrial New Jobs Training Certificates, and the Board is therefore now authorized to proceed with the issuance of \$2,095,000 of Industrial New Jobs Training Certificates.

Section 1. Definitions. The following terms shall have the following meanings in this Resolution unless the text expressly or by necessary implication requires otherwise:

"Beneficial Owner" means, whenever used with respect to the Certificates, the person in whose name such Certificate is recorded as the beneficial owner of such Certificate by a Participant on the records of such Participant or such person's subrogee.

"Blanket Issuer Letter of Representations" means the Representation Letter from the Issuer to DTC, with respect to the Certificates.

"Cede & Co." means Cede & Co., the nominee of DTC, and any successor nominee of DTC with respect to the Certificates.

"Certificates" or "Industrial New Jobs Training Certificates" means \$2,095,000 Western Iowa Tech Community College Industrial New Jobs Training Certificates, authorized to be issued by this Resolution.

"Code" means the Code of Iowa, as amended.

"Continuing Disclosure Certificate" means the Continuing Disclosure Certificate executed by the Issuer and dated the date of issuance and delivery of the Certificates, as originally executed and as it may be amended from time to time.

"Costs of Issuance and Administration Fund" means the Fund required to be established by this Resolution for the deposit of that portion of the proceeds of the Certificates to be expended for costs of issuance and administration.

"DTC" means The Depository Trust Company, New York, New York, which will act as securities depository for the Certificates pursuant to the Representation Letter.

"Fiscal Year" means the twelve months' period beginning on July 1 of each year and ending on the last day of June of the following year, or any other consecutive twelve month

period adopted by the governing body or by law as the official accounting period of the Project.

"Governing Body" means the Board of Directors of the College, or its successor in function with respect to the operation and control of the Project.

"Issuer" and "College" means Western Iowa Tech Community College, Sioux City, Iowa.

"Merged Area" means the corporate boundaries of the Issuer including all or a portion of the following Counties: Buena Vista, Carroll, Cherokee, Crawford, Harrison, Ida, Monona, Plymouth, Sac, Shelby, Sioux and Woodbury.

"Net Revenues" means the revenues and funds derived from the Agreements, held in the Revenue Fund and pledged to the payment of the Certificates.

"Original Purchaser" means the purchaser of the Certificates from the Issuer at the time of their original issuance.

"Parity Certificates" means Industrial New Jobs Training Certificates payable solely from the Net Revenues of the Project on an equal basis with the Certificates herein authorized to be issued.

"Participants" means those broker-dealers, banks and other financial institutions for which DTC holds Certificates as securities depository.

"Paying Agent" means the Office of the President, Western Iowa Tech Community College, or successor as may be approved by Issuer and who will carry out the duties as Issuer's agent to provide for the payment of principal of and interest on the Certificates when due.

"Permitted Investments" means:

- direct obligations of (including obligations issued or held in book entry form on the books of) the Department of the Treasury of the United States of America;
- cash (insured at all times by the Federal Deposit Insurance Corporation or otherwise collateralized with obligations described in the above paragraph);

▪ obligations of any of the following federal agencies which obligations represent full faith and credit of the United States of America, including:

- Export - Import Bank
- Farm Credit System Financial Assistance Corporation
- Farmers Home Administration
- General Services Administration
- U.S. Maritime Administration
- Small Business Administration
- Government National Mortgage Association (GNMA)
- U.S. Department of Housing & Urban Development (PHA's)
- Federal Housing Administration

▪ repurchase agreements whose underlying collateral consists of the investments set out above if the Issuer takes delivery of the collateral either directly or through an authorized custodian. Repurchase agreements do not include reverse repurchase agreements;

▪ an obligation permitted for purchase and investment by political subdivisions, under the provisions of Chapters 12B and 12C, Code of Iowa, as amended, or successor laws;

▪ investments in a money market fund rated "AAAm" or "AAAm-G" or better by S&P and meeting the requirements of Section 12B.10(5)(f) Code of Iowa, as amended, or its successor provision of law;

▪ pre-refunded Municipal Obligations defined as any bonds or other obligations of any state of the United States of America or of any agency, instrumentality or local governmental unit of any such state which are not callable at the option of the obligor prior to maturity or as to which irrevocable instructions have been given by the obligor to call on the date specified in the notice; and (a) which are rated, based on an irrevocable escrow account or fund (the "escrow"), in the highest rating category of S&P or Moody's or any successors thereto; or (b)(i) which are fully secured as to principal and interest and redemption premium, if any, by an escrow consisting only of cash or direct obligations of the Department of the Treasury of the United States of America, which escrow may be applied only to the payment of such principal of and interest and redemption premium, if any, on such bonds or other obligations on the maturity date or dates thereof or the specified redemption date or dates pursuant to such irrevocable instructions, as appropriate; and (ii) which escrow is sufficient, as verified by a nationally recognized independent certified public accountant, to pay principal of and interest and redemption premium, if any, on the bonds or other obligations described in

this paragraph on the maturity date or dates specified in the irrevocable instructions referred to above, as appropriate;

- an investment contract rated within the two highest classifications as established by at least one of the standard rating services approved by the superintendent of banking by rule adopted pursuant to Chapter 17A Code of Iowa, as amended; and

- investments otherwise permitted in this Resolution may be made through a joint investment trust which qualifies under Section 12B.10(5)(a)(7) of the Code of Iowa, as amended, or successor provisions of law.

"Project" means the training arrangement and new jobs training program which is the subject of the Agreement.

"Project Fund" means the Fund established by this Resolution for the deposit of that portion of the proceeds of the Certificates to be expended for the Project.

"Registrar" means Office of the President, Western Iowa Tech Community College of Sioux City, Iowa, or any successor approved by the Issuer who shall carry out the duties prescribed with respect to maintaining a register of the owners of the Certificates. Unless otherwise specified, the Registrar shall also act as Transfer Agent for the Certificates.

"Representation Letter" means the Blanket Issuer Letter of Representations from the Issuer to the DTC, with respect to the Certificates.

"Resolution" means this Resolution of the Issuer adopted on May 13, 2024, authorizing the issuance of the Certificates.

"Revenue Fund" means the special tax fund required to be established by this Resolution.

"Secretary" means the Secretary of the Governing Body or such other officer of the successor governing body as shall be charged with substantially the same duties and responsibilities.

"Standby Tax" means the annual levy of a tax upon all taxable property within the Merged Area provided for in Section 260E.6(4) of the Act.

"Treasurer" means the College Treasurer or such other officer as shall succeed to the same duties and responsibilities with respect to the recording and payment of the Certificates issued hereunder.

Section 2. Authority. The Certificates authorized by this Resolution shall be issued pursuant to the Act, and in compliance with all applicable provisions of the Constitution and laws of the State of Iowa.

Section 3. Authorization and Purpose. There are hereby authorized to be issued, negotiable Industrial New Jobs Training Certificates of Western Iowa Tech Community College in the Counties of Buena Vista, Carroll, Cherokee, Crawford, Harrison, Ida, Monona, Plymouth, Sac, Shelby, Sioux and Woodbury, State of Iowa, Series 2024-1, each to be designated as "Industrial New Jobs Training Certificate", in the aggregate amount of \$2,095,000 for the purpose of carrying out the Project in accordance with the Agreement.

Section 4. Source of Payment. As provided and required by the Act and the Agreement, the Certificates and interest thereon shall be payable solely from the Net Revenues of the Project including the Revenue Fund.

The College hereby pledges to the payment of the Certificates the Revenue Fund which shall include the following:

- New jobs credit from withholding as described in Section 260E.5 of the Act received or derived from new employment resulting from the Agreements;
- Supplemental new jobs credit from withholding as described in Section 15A.7 Code of Iowa, as amended, received or derived from new employment resulting from the Agreements;
- Tuition, student fees, or special charges fixed by the Board of Directors of the College to defray program costs in whole or in part; and
- The Standby Tax upon all taxable property within the Merged Area referred to in the Act and levied by this Resolution.

Section 5. Levy and Certification of Annual Tax.

a) Levy of Annual Tax. To further secure and provide funds to pay the principal and interest of the Certificates, the following direct annual tax on all taxable property in the Merged Area will be levied and appropriated to the Revenue Fund for each future year as follows:

b) Resolution to be Filed With County Auditor. A certified copy of this Resolution shall be filed with the County Auditor of each County contained within the Merged Area, and each Auditor is instructed to levy and assess the tax authorized in like manner as other taxes are levied and assessed, to collect the taxes in like manner as other taxes of the Merged Area are collected, and when collected used for the purpose of paying principal of and interest on the Certificates issued in anticipation of the taxes, and for no other purpose whatsoever. Provided, however, that the Governing Body may direct the adjustment and corresponding reduction of any levy of taxes made whenever funds on hand from any source other than taxation and which may be appropriated to the payment of the Certificates are available in the Revenue Fund.

Section 6. Certificate Details, Execution and Redemption.

a) Certificate Details. The Certificates shall be dated June 5, 2024, and bear interest from that date, until payment, at the principal office of the Paying Agent. Interest shall be paid on December 1, 2024, and semiannually thereafter on the 1st day of June and December in each year until maturity at the rates hereinafter provided.

The Certificates shall be executed by the manual or facsimile signature of the President of the Governing Body and attested by the manual or facsimile signature of the Secretary of the Governing Body and shall be fully registered as to both principal and interest as provided in this Resolution. Principal and interest shall be payable at the office of the Paying Agent. The Certificates shall be each in the denomination of \$5,000 and shall mature and bear interest as follows:

b) Redemption. Certificates maturing after June 1, 2030 may be called for redemption by the Issuer and paid before maturity on said date or any date thereafter, from any funds regardless of source, in whole or from time to time in part, in any order of maturity and within an annual maturity by lot. The terms of redemption shall be par, plus accrued interest to date of call.

Thirty days' notice of redemption shall be given to the registered owner of the Certificate. Failure to give such notice to any registered owner of the Certificates or any defect therein shall not affect the validity of any proceedings for the redemption of the Certificates. Notice will be deemed completed upon transmission to the owner of record of the Certificate. All Certificates or portions thereof called for redemption will cease to bear interest after the specified redemption date, provided funds for their redemption are on deposit at the place of payment.

If less than all Certificates of a maturity are called for redemption, the Registrar will notify DTC of the particular amount of such maturity to be redeemed. DTC will determine by lot the amount of each Participant's interest in such maturity to be redeemed, and each participant will then select by lot the Beneficial Owner's interest in such maturity to be redeemed until the total amount of Certificates to be called has been reached.

The principal amount of any Term Certificates may be reduced through the earlier optional redemption, with any partial optional redemption of the Term Certificates credited against future mandatory redemption requirements for such Term Certificates in such order as the Board shall determine.

Section 7. DTC - Registration.

Section 7.1. The Certificates must be registered in the name of Cede & Co., as nominee for DTC. Payment of semiannual interest for any Certificate registered in the name of Cede & Co. will be made by wire transfer or New York Clearing House or equivalent same day funds to the account of Cede & Co. on the interest payment date for the Certificates at the address indicated or in the Representation Letter.

Section 7.2. The Certificates will be initially issued in the form of separate single authenticated fully registered certificates in the amount of each stated maturity of the Certificates. Upon initial issuance, the ownership of the Certificates will be registered in the registry books of the Office of the President, Western Iowa Tech Community College kept by the Paying Agent and Registrar in the name of Cede & Co., as nominee of DTC. The Paying Agent and Registrar and the Issuer may treat DTC (or its nominee) as the sole and exclusive owner of the Certificates registered in its name for the purposes of payment of the principal or redemption price of or interest on the Certificates, selecting the Certificates or portions to be redeemed, giving any notice permitted or required to be given to registered owners of Certificates under the Resolution of the Issuer, registering the transfer of Certificates, obtaining any consent or other action to be taken by registered owners of the Certificates and for other purposes. The Paying Agent, Registrar and the Issuer have no responsibility or obligation to any Participant or person claiming a beneficial ownership interest in the Certificates under or through DTC or any Participant with respect to the accuracy of records maintained by DTC or any Participant; with respect to the payment by DTC or Participant of an amount of principal or redemption price of or interest on the Certificates; with respect to any notice given to owners of Certificates under the Resolution; with respect to the person selected to receive payment in the event of a partial redemption of the Certificates, or a

consent given or other action taken by DTC as registered owner of the Certificates. The Paying Agent and Registrar shall pay all principal of and premium, if any, and interest on the Certificates only to Cede & Co. in accordance with the Representation Letter, and all payments are valid and effective to fully satisfy and discharge the Issuer's obligations with respect to the principal of and premium, if any, and interest on the Certificates to the extent of the sum paid. DTC must receive an authenticated Certificate for each separate stated maturity evidencing the obligation of the Issuer to make payments of principal of and premium, if any, and interest. Upon delivery by DTC to the Paying Agent and Registrar of written notice that DTC has determined to substitute a new nominee in place of Cede & Co., the Certificates will be transferable to the new nominee in accordance with this Section.

Section 7.3. In the event the Issuer determines that it is in the best interest of the Beneficial Owners that they be able to obtain Certificates, the Issuer may notify DTC and the Paying Agent and Registrar, whereupon DTC will notify the Participants, of the availability through DTC of Certificates. The Certificates will be transferable in accordance with this Section. DTC may determine to discontinue providing its services with respect to the Certificates at any time by giving notice to the Issuer and the Paying Agent and Registrar and discharging its responsibilities under applicable law. In this event, the Certificates will be transferable in accordance with this Section.

Section 7.4. Notwithstanding any other provision of the Resolution to the contrary, so long as any Certificate is registered in the name of Cede & Co., as nominee of DTC, all payments with respect to the principal of and premium, if any, and interest on the Certificate and all notices must be made and given, respectively to DTC as provided in the Representation letter.

Section 7.5. In connection with any notice or other communication to be provided to holders of the Certificates by the Issuer or the Paying Agent and Registrar with respect to a consent or other action to be taken by holders of the Certificates, the Issuer or the Paying Agent and Registrar, as the case may be, shall establish a record date for the consent or other action and give DTC notice of the record date not less than 15 calendar days in advance of the record date to the extent possible. Notice to DTC must be given only when DTC is the sole holder.

Section 7.6. The execution and delivery of the Representation Letter to DTC by the Issuer is ratified and confirmed. The Representation Letter is on file with DTC and sets forth certain matters with respect to, among other things, notices, consents and approvals by holders of the Certificates and payments on the Certificates.

Section 7.7. In the event that a transfer or exchange of the Certificates is permitted under this Section, the transfer or exchange may be accomplished upon receipt by the Registrar from the registered owners of the Certificates to be transferred or exchanged and appropriate instruments of transfer. In the event Certificate certificates are issued to holders other than Cede & Co., its successor as nominee for DTC as holder of all the Certificates, or other securities depository as holder of all the Certificates, the provisions of the Resolution apply to, among other things, the printing of certificates and the method or payment of principal of and interest on the Certificates.

Section 7.8. The officers of the Issuer are authorized and directed to prepare and furnish to the purchaser, and to the attorneys approving the legality of Certificates, certified copies of proceedings, ordinances, resolutions and records and all certificates and affidavits and other instruments as may be required to evidence the legality and marketability of the Certificates, and all certified copies, certificates, affidavits and other instruments constitute representations of the Issuer as to the correctness of all stated or recited facts.

Section 8. Registration of Certificates; Appointment of Registrar; Transfer; Ownership; Delivery; and Cancellation.

a) Registration. The ownership of Certificates may be transferred only by the making of an entry upon the books kept for the registration and transfer of ownership of the Certificates, and in no other way. Office of the President, Western Iowa Tech Community College is hereby appointed as Registrar under the terms of this Resolution. Registrar shall maintain the books of the Issuer for the registration of ownership of the Certificates for the payment of principal of and interest on the Certificates as provided in this Resolution. All Certificates shall be negotiable as provided in Article 8 of the Uniform Commercial Code subject to the provisions for registration and transfer contained in the Certificates and in this Resolution.

b) Transfer. The ownership of any Certificate may be transferred only upon the books kept for the registration and transfer of Certificates and only upon surrender of the Certificate at the office of the Registrar together with an assignment duly executed by the holder or his duly authorized attorney in fact in such form as shall be satisfactory to the Registrar, along with the address and social security number or federal employer identification number of such transferee (or, if registration is to be made in the name of multiple individuals, of all such transferees). In the event that the address of the registered owner of a Certificate (other than a registered owner which is the nominee of the broker or dealer in question) is that of a broker or dealer, there must be disclosed on the registration books the information pertaining to the registered owner required above. Upon the transfer of any such Certificate, a new fully registered Certificate, of any denomination or denominations permitted by this Resolution in aggregate principal amount equal to the unmatured and unredeemed principal amount of such transferred fully registered Certificate, and bearing interest at the same rate and maturing on the same date or dates shall be delivered by the Registrar.

c) Registration of Transferred Certificates. In all cases of the transfer of the Certificates, the Registrar shall register the Certificates at the earliest practicable time, on the registration books in accordance with the provisions of this Resolution.

d) Ownership. The person in whose name the ownership shall be registered on the registration books of the Registrar shall be deemed as the absolute owner for all purposes, and payment of or on account of the principal of and interest on any such Certificates and

the premium, if any, shall be made only to or upon the order of the registered owner or his legal representative. All such payments shall be valid and effectual to satisfy and discharge the liability upon such Certificate, including the interest thereon, to the extent of the sum or sums so paid.

e) Cancellation. All Certificates which have been redeemed shall not be reissued but shall be cancelled by the Registrar. All Certificates which are cancelled by the Registrar shall be destroyed and a certificate of the destruction shall be furnished promptly to the Issuer; provided that if the Issuer shall so direct, the Registrar shall forward the cancelled Certificates to the Issuer.

f) Non-Presentation of Certificates. If a payment check representing payment of interest on the Certificates is returned to the Paying Agent or if any Certificate is not presented for payment of principal and/or interest at the maturity or redemption date, and funds sufficient to pay the principal of and interest on Certificates has been made available to the Paying Agent for the benefit of the owner of such Certificate, all liability of the Issuer to the owner for the principal of and interest on the Certificates shall cease, terminate and be completely discharged, and it shall then be the duty of the Paying Agent to hold the funds, without liability for interest thereon, for the benefit of the owner of such Certificates who shall be restricted exclusively to the funds for any claim of whatever nature on his part under this Resolution or on, or with respect to, the principal of and interest on the Certificates. The Paying Agent's obligation to hold such funds shall continue for a period of two years and six months following the date on which the interest and/or principal became due, whether at maturity, or at the date fixed for redemption thereof, or otherwise, at which time the Paying Agent, shall surrender any remaining funds to the Issuer, whereupon any claim under this Resolution by the owners of the Certificates shall be made upon the Issuer.

g) Registration and Transfer Fees. The Registrar may furnish to each owner, at the Issuer's expense, one Certificate for each annual maturity. The Registrar shall furnish additional Certificates in lesser denominations (but not less than the minimum denomination) to an owner who so requests.

Section 9. Reissuance of Mutilated, Destroyed, Stolen or Lost Certificates. In case any outstanding Certificate shall become mutilated or be destroyed, stolen or lost, the Issuer shall at the request of Registrar authenticate and deliver a new Certificate of like tenor and amount as the Certificate so mutilated, destroyed, stolen or lost, in exchange and substitution for such mutilated Certificate to Registrar, upon surrender of such mutilated Certificate, or in lieu of and substitution for the Certificate destroyed, stolen or lost, upon filing with the Registrar evidence satisfactory to the Registrar and Issuer that such Certificate has been destroyed, stolen or lost and proof of ownership thereof, and upon furnishing the Registrar and Issuer with satisfactory indemnity and complying with any other reasonable regulations that the Issuer or its agent may prescribe and paying any expenses of the Issuer.

Section 10. Record Date. Payments of principal and interest, other than upon full redemption, made in respect of any Certificate, shall be made to the registered holder or to their designated agent who appears on the books of the Registrar on the 15th day of the month preceding the payment date. Such payments shall fully discharge the obligations of the Issuer in respect of such Certificates to the extent of the payments so made. Upon receipt of the final payment of principal, the holder of the Certificate shall surrender the Certificate to the Paying Agent.

Section 11. Execution, Authentication and Delivery of the Certificates. Upon the adoption of this Resolution, the President and Secretary of the Governing Body shall execute the Certificates by their manual or facsimile signature and deliver the Certificates to the Registrar, who shall authenticate the Certificates and deliver the Certificates to the Purchaser. No Certificate shall be valid or obligatory for any purpose or shall be entitled to any right or benefit of this Resolution unless the Registrar shall endorse and execute thereon a Certificate of Authentication substantially in the form of the Certificate herein set forth. Such Certificate shall be conclusive evidence that the authenticated Certificate has been issued under this Resolution and that the holder is entitled to the benefits of this Resolution.

No Certificates shall be authenticated and delivered by the Registrar unless the following have been provided:

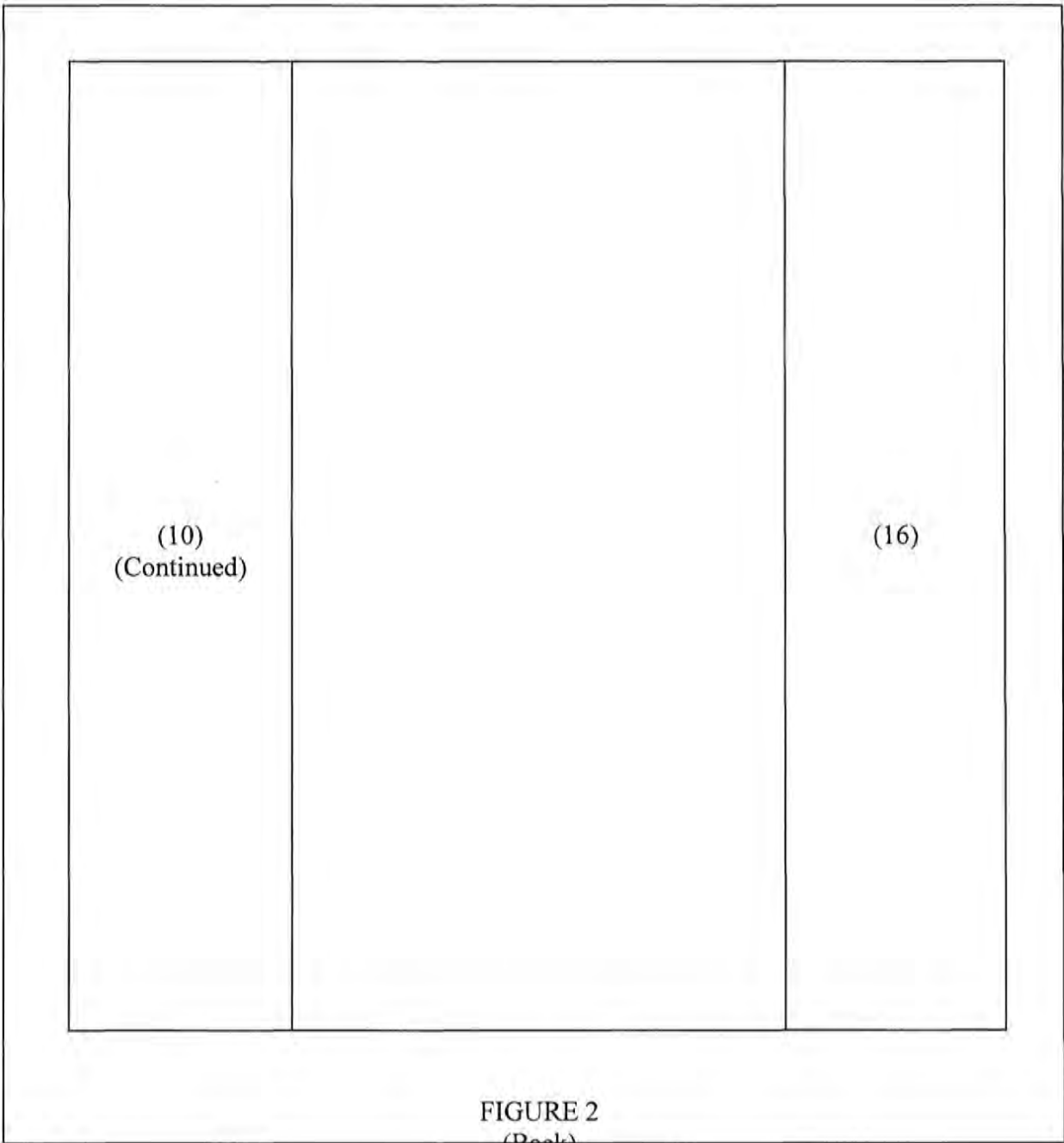

Section 13. Right to Name Substitute Paying Agent or Registrar. Issuer reserves the right to name a substitute, successor Registrar or Paying Agent upon giving written notice to each registered holder.

Section 14. Application of Revenues. From and after the delivery of any Certificates, and as long as any of the Certificates or Parity Certificates shall be outstanding and unpaid either as to principal or as to interest, or until all of the Certificates and Parity Certificates then outstanding shall have been discharged and satisfied in the manner provided in this Resolution, the Revenue Fund containing the revenues of the Project shall be deposited as collected in a fund to be known as the 2024-1 Multiple Revenue Fund (the "Revenue Fund") and shall be disbursed in the order following:

a) Sinking Fund. There is hereby established and shall be maintained a special fund from which interest and principal on the Certificates will be paid. The fund shall be known as the 2024-1 Multiple Project, Revenue Principal and Interest Fund (the "Sinking Fund"). The amount to be deposited in the Sinking Fund in any year shall be an amount equal to the interest and principal coming due on the Certificates during the fiscal year. Money shall be first deposited into the Interest Account of the Sinking Fund in an amount equal to the interest falling due in each fiscal year. Money shall next be deposited into the Principal Account of the Sinking Fund in an amount equal to the principal falling due in each fiscal year. Money in the Sinking Fund shall be used solely for the purpose of paying principal of and interest on the Certificates and Parity Certificates, as the same shall become due and payable.

b) Capitalized Reserve Fund. There is hereby established a debt service reserve fund. Such fund shall be known as the 2024-1 Multiple Project, Revenue Debt Service Reserve Fund (the "Reserve Fund"). Money in the Reserve Fund shall be used solely for the purpose of paying principal at maturity or interest on the Certificates when insufficient money shall be available in the Sinking Fund.

c) Subordinate Obligations. Revenues of the Project not required for the Sinking Fund or the Reserve Fund may be used to pay principal of and interest on (including reasonable reserves therefor) any other obligations which by their terms shall be payable from the revenues of the Project, but subordinate to the Certificates and Parity Certificates, and which have been issued for the purposes of the Project.

d) Surplus Revenue. All revenues thereafter remaining shall be deposited to remedy any deficiency in any of the funds created by this Resolution, may be used to pay or reimburse the Issuer or the Employer for other loans, moneys advanced to or indebtedness incurred to finance or refinance in whole or in part the Project, as permitted by law, or may be used to pay or redeem the Certificates or Parity Certificates in whole or in part, or for any lawful purpose.

The provisions of this Section shall not be construed to require the Issuer to maintain separate bank accounts for the funds created by this Section; except the Sinking Fund and the Reserve Fund shall be maintained in a separate account but may be invested in conjunction with other funds of the Issuer but designated as a trust fund on the books and records of the Issuer.

Section 15. Application of Certificate Proceeds. Proceeds of the Certificates shall be applied as follows:

- An amount equal to accrued interest, if any, on the Certificates shall be credited to the Sinking Fund for application to the first interest payment on the Certificates.
- An amount equal to \$ _____ shall be credited to the Reserve Fund.
- An amount equal to \$ _____ shall be credited to the Costs of Issuance and Administration Fund which is hereby created and expended for the costs of issuance of the Certificates (including but not limited to underwriting, accounting and legal fees, printing costs, Trustee, Registrar, Paying Agent and Agency fees and expenses; other fees relating to the issuance of the Certificates and administration of the Project).
- An amount equal to \$ _____ shall be credited to the Project Fund which is hereby created and expended for the purposes of the Project.
- Any amounts on hand in the Project Fund shall be available for the payment of the principal of or interest on the Certificates at any time that other funds shall be insufficient for that purpose. Any balance on hand in the Project Fund and not immediately required for its purposes may be invested not inconsistent with limitations provided by law or this Resolution.

Moneys on hand in the Project Fund and the Revenue Fund and all of the subaccounts of the Revenue Fund may be invested only in Permitted Investments or deposited in insured deposits of financial institutions which are members of the Federal Deposit Insurance Corporation ("FDIC") or its equivalent successor. All deposits exceeding the maximum amount insured from time to time by the FDIC or its equivalent successor in any one financial institution shall be continuously secured by a valid pledge of direct obligations of the United States Government having an equivalent market value. All such interim investments shall mature before the date on which the moneys are required for the purposes for which the fund was created or may otherwise be used pursuant to this Resolution.

All income derived from such investments shall be deposited in the Revenue Fund and shall be regarded as revenues of the Project. Such investments shall at any time necessary be liquidated and the proceeds thereof applied to the purpose for which the respective fund was created.

Section 16. Disposition of Certificate Proceeds. The proceeds from the issuance and sale of the Certificates shall be applied to payment of costs of the Project and costs of issuance of the Certificates or to pay the principal of or interest on the Certificates when due and for no other purpose.

Disbursements for payment of costs of the Project shall be made by the Treasurer upon receipt of vouchers approved by the Governing Body.

Section 17. Covenants Regarding the Operation of the Project. The Issuer hereby covenants and agrees with each and every holder of the Certificates and Parity Certificates:

a) Maintenance in Force. The Issuer will maintain the Project in force and will annually cause the taxes and other revenues to be levied and applied as provided in this Resolution.

b) Accounting and Audits. The Issuer will cause to be kept proper books and accounts adapted to the Project and Agreements in accordance with generally accepted accounting practices, and will cause the books and accounts to be audited on an annual basis by an independent auditor which may be the auditor of the State of Iowa

c) State Laws. That the Issuer will faithfully and punctually perform all duties with reference to the Project required by the Constitution and laws of the State of Iowa, and will segregate the revenues of the Project and apply said revenues to the funds specified in this Resolution.

Section 18. Remedies of Holders. Except as herein expressly limited the holders of the Certificates and Parity Certificates shall have and possess all the rights of action and remedies afforded by the common law, the Constitution and statutes of the State of Iowa, and of the United

States of America, for the enforcement of payment of their Certificates, and of the pledge of the revenues made hereunder, and of all covenants of the Issuer hereunder.

Section 19. Prior Lien and Parity Certificates. The Issuer will issue no other Certificates or obligations of any kind or nature payable from or enjoying a lien or claim on the property or revenues of the Project having priority over the Certificates or Parity Certificates.

Additional Certificates may be issued on a parity and equality of rank with the Certificates with respect to the lien and claim of such additional Certificates to the revenues of the Project and the money on deposit in the funds adopted by this Resolution, for the following purposes and under the following conditions, but not otherwise:

a) For the purpose of refunding any of the Certificates or Parity Certificates which have matured or which shall mature not later than three months after the date of delivery of such refunding Certificates and for the payment of which there shall be insufficient money in the Sinking Fund and the Reserve Fund;

b) For the purpose of the Project or additional projects, so long as Net Revenues are sufficient to secure the Certificates and additional certificates. Additional certificates must be payable as to principal and as to interest on the same month and day as the certificates herein authorized.

Section 20. Discharge and Satisfaction of Certificates. The covenants, liens and pledges entered into, created or imposed pursuant to this Resolution may be fully discharged and satisfied with respect to the Certificates and Parity Certificates, or any of them, in any one or more of the following ways:

a) By paying the Certificates or Parity Certificates when the same shall become due and payable; or

b) By depositing in trust with the Treasurer, or with a corporate trustee designated by the Governing Body for the payment of the obligations and irrevocably appropriated exclusively to that purpose an amount in cash or direct obligations of the United States the maturities and yield of which shall be sufficient to retire at maturity, or by redemption prior to maturity on any designated date upon which the obligations may be redeemed, all of the obligations outstanding at the time, together with the interest thereon to maturity or to the designated redemption date, premiums thereon, if any that may be payable on the redemption of the same; provided that proper notice of redemption of all the obligations to be redeemed shall have been previously published or provisions shall have been made for such publication.

Upon such payment or deposit of money or securities, or both, in the amount and manner provided by this Section, all liability of the Issuer with respect to the Certificates or Parity

Certificates shall cease, determine and be completely discharged, and the holders thereof shall be entitled only to payment out of money or securities so deposited.

Section 21. Resolution a Contract. The provisions of this Resolution shall constitute a contract between the Issuer and the owner or owners of the Certificates and Parity Certificates, and after the issuance of any of the Certificates no change, variation or alteration of any kind in the provisions of this Resolution shall be made in any manner, except as provided in the next succeeding Section, until such time as all of the Certificates and Parity Certificates, and interest due thereon, shall have been satisfied and discharged as provided in this Resolution.

Section 22. Amendment of Resolution Without Consent. The Issuer may, without the consent of or notice to any of the holders of the Certificates and Parity Certificates, amend or supplement this Resolution for any one or more of the following purposes:

a) to cure any ambiguity, defect, omission or inconsistent provision in this Resolution or in the Certificates or Parity Certificates; or to comply with any application, provision of law or regulation of federal or state agencies; provided, however, that such action shall not materially adversely affect the interests of the holders of the Certificates or Parity Certificates;

b) to change the terms or provisions of this Resolution to the extent necessary to prevent the interest on the Certificates or Parity Certificates from being includable within the gross income of the holders thereof for federal income tax purposes;

c) to grant to or confer upon the holders of the Certificates or Parity Certificates any additional rights, remedies, powers or authority that may lawfully be granted to or conferred upon the holders of the Certificates;

d) to add to the covenants and agreements of the Issuer contained in this Resolution other covenants and agreements of, or conditions or restrictions upon, the Issuer or to surrender or eliminate any right or power reserved to or conferred upon the Issuer in this Resolution; or

e) to subject to the lien and pledge of this Resolution additional pledged revenues as may be permitted by law.

Section 23. Amendment of Resolution Requiring Consent. This Resolution may be amended from time to time if such amendment has been consented to by holders of not less than two-thirds in principal amount of the outstanding Certificates and Parity Certificates (not including any Certificates which may then be held or owned by or for the account of the Issuer, but including such refunding Certificates issued for the purpose of refunding any of the Certificates if the refunding Certificates are not owned by the Issuer); but this Resolution may not be amended in such manner as to:

a) Make any change in the maturity or interest rate of the Certificates, or modify the terms of payment of principal or interest on the Certificates or impose any conditions with respect to such payment;

b) Materially affect the rights of the holders of less than all of the outstanding Certificates and Parity Certificates; and

c) Reduce the percentage of the principal amount of Certificates, the consent of the holders of which is required to effect a further amendment.

Whenever the Issuer proposes to amend this Resolution under the provisions of this Section, it shall file notice of the proposed amendment with the Original Purchaser and publish notice one time in a newspaper having general circulation in the State of Iowa, or a financial newspaper or journal published in Chicago, Illinois. The notice shall briefly set forth the nature of the proposed amendment and shall state that a copy of the proposed amendatory Resolution is on file in the office of the Secretary of the Governing Body.

If within one year from the date of the publication of the notice an instrument is filed with the Secretary of the Governing Body executed by the holders of at least two-thirds in aggregate principal amount of the outstanding Certificates referring to the proposed amendatory Resolution described in the notice and specifically consenting to and approving the adoption thereof, the Governing Body of the Issuer may adopt the amendatory Resolution and the Resolution shall become effective and binding upon the holders of all of the Certificates and Parity Certificates.

Section 25. Continuing Disclosure. The Issuer hereby covenants and agrees that it will comply with and carry out all of the provisions of the Continuing Disclosure Certificate, and the provisions of the Continuing Disclosure Certificate are hereby incorporated by reference as part of this Resolution and made a part hereof. Notwithstanding any other provision of this Resolution, failure of the Issuer to comply with the Continuing Disclosure Certificate shall not be considered an event of default under this Resolution; however, any holder of the Certificates or Beneficial Owner may take such actions as may be necessary and appropriate, including seeking specific performance by court order, to cause the Issuer to comply with its obligations under the Continuing Disclosure Certificate. Section 26. Repeal of Conflicting Ordinances or Resolutions and Effective Date. All other ordinances, resolutions and orders, in conflict with the provisions of this Resolution are, to the extent of such conflict, hereby repealed; and this Resolution shall be in effect from and after its adoption.

This Disclosure Certificate is being executed and delivered by the Issuer for the benefit of the Holders and Beneficial Owners of the Certificates and in order to assist the Participating Underwriters in complying with S.E.C. Rule 15c2-12(b)(5). This Disclosure Certificate shall be governed by, construed and interpreted in accordance with the Rule, and, to the extent not in conflict with the Rule, the laws of the State. The Issuer shall clearly identify each such other document so included by reference.

Section 5. Reporting of Significant Events.

a) Pursuant to the provisions of this Section, the Issuer shall give, or cause to be given, notice of the occurrence of any of the following events with respect to the Certificates in a timely manner not later than 10 Business Days after the day of the occurrence of the event:

Perkins V is the latest version of the Carl D. Perkins Career and Technical Education Act. This federal legislation focuses on supporting career and technical education (CTE) programs at both the secondary and post-secondary levels. Iowa receives nearly \$13.9 million annually in federal funds which are distributed to public school districts and community college with administrative oversight from the Iowa Department of Education. Perkins V emphasizes the following:

- 1) Data Driven Decision Making
- 2) Alignment with Workforce Needs
- 3) Program Quality Improvement
- 4) Equity and Access
- 5) Credential Attainment

For FY2024 Western Iowa Tech received \$622,268 in Perkins funds. A proposed budget/spending plan was submitted to, and approved by, the Iowa Department of Education.

The FY24 Western Iowa Tech Perkins budget includes:

\$394,000	Equipment for CTE programming
\$48,000	Faculty development for CTE Instructors
\$45,000	Staff to support Career Services and Career Navigation
\$41,000	CTSO Coordination, Training, Travel and Membership
\$30,000	Advertising to non-traditional student populations
\$18,000	Wages for professional tutors in the Comet Learning Center
\$15,000	Training and assessment support for CTE Instructors



The budget aims to positively impact the performance indicators outlined in Perkins as well as specific Iowa defined goals focused on non-traditional participation, earned credentials and job placement. Western Iowa Tech has annually spent a large portion of the budget on ensuring the latest equipment and technology in labs as well as the ongoing training of our career and technical instructors. Another major expenditure is the support of students' success through tutors and other support staff.

Perkins funds continue to be a key tool in providing high quality career and technical instruction. These funds have had a major impact in providing cutting edge lab environments and supports for students, as well as keeping our instructors abreast of new technologies within their discipline. We are currently working on the FY25 Perkins Budget with similar spending plan and plan to have that submitted to the Iowa Department of Education in May.
